1. **CALL TO ORDER** Meeting called to order by Chair Bowlby at 6:00 P.M.

4. **PUBLIC COMMENT (3 Minutes/speaker)**

5. **ADOPTION OF MEETING SUMMARIES FROM MARCH 1ST, 2011**

Member Barclay moved to approve Meeting Summary from March 1st, 2011, seconded by Member McDonald, item passed.
6. **COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION REPORTS**

7. **STAFF/AGENCY REPORTS**
  - A. Staff reported that Contra Costa County Health Services Department has declared Alamo a “HeartSafe Community”. The HeartSafe Community campaign partners with the American Heart Association to determine a community’s ability to provide early access to emergency care, early CPR, early defibrillation and early advanced care.
  - B. Staff reported that Caltrans will hold a public open house from 6:00 – 8:00 P.M. on Wednesday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> on its rehabilitation project of HWY 680. The meeting will take place at the San Ramon Community Center, Central Park Fountain Room, 12501 Alcosta Blvd.
  - C. Staff reported that State Senator Mark DeSaulnier will be in Alamo to meet with the public on Saturday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Alamo Women’s Club located at 1401 Danville Blvd. Attendees can bring ideas, get help with a problem involving a state agency or give opinions on legislation. Appointments are not necessary.

10. **DELIBERATION ITEMS**
  - A. 2100 Stone Valley Road – Review and consider Land Use Application LP09-2026. The San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District proposes to build a new 9,400 square foot single-story fire station on a 1.1 acre single-family residence lot.

San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District Chief Richard Price, Assistant Chief Steven Hart, and Members of the San Ramon Valley Board of Directors were present to provide to the MAC and community a history and update on their proposed Land Use Application. The District noted they had been working with neighbors to the proposed facility for over one year through various community outreach meetings and discussions to bring them to the design they have submitted to the County today for review and approval.

The District had on-hand their project representatives to address questions and concerns as noted by both the MAC and the public. Participating in the discussions were; Bob Deiss, Architect with ATI, Jason Mirise, ESA Noise, Lesley Lowe, ESA Traffic Engineer, Jonathan Buck, Engeo, and Sean O’Brien, LSA Biology.

1. Any major changes to the proposed project are brought back before the MAC for further review.
2. A landscape strip be installed between the curb on Miranda and the sidewalk fronting the Fire Station to be maintained by the Fire District.
3. The Fire District return to the MAC for review of the final landscape plans and building color scheme.
4. Recommend County Public Works approval of the exception to the creek setback as set forth in the County Subdivision ordinance as proposed.
5. The MAC supports the proposed project be LEED-Silver certified.

Motion seconded by Member Mick. Item passed unanimously.
